Some months after the first announcement of the International Colloquium on Political Violence in the Twentieth Century, this second announcement gives some more information on the conference. We are pleased to give out the names of the keynote speakers who are taking part in the colloquium. Likewise, we inform those potentially interested about the registration fees and about some other details. We continue to encourage the submission of proposals of papers and panels that gather information on the main topics detailed below, as well as on other issues linked with political violence — understood in a broad sense. The deadline to submit paper proposals has been extended until December 15th, 2014; all the participants will have 15-20 minutes to present their work, and the papers – to be published under ISBN – must be sent no later than March 1st, 2015 and follow the directions detailed below.

- Guerilla warfare, insurrection, armed struggle.
- Violation of human rights and of fundamental rights and freedoms.
- Memory about traumatic processes of violence.
- Clashes, riots and diffuse forms of violence.
- The political content of the common law acts of violence.
- Torture and police brutality.
- Prison and punitive and rehabilitative institutions.
- Repressive legislation.
- Deserters, antimilitarism and pacifism.

Deadlines

- Abstract submission: **December 15th, 2014.**
- Acceptance notification: **December 22nd, 2014.**
- Complete paper submission: **March 1st, 2015.**

Directions to be considered before writing your proposal

- The abstract should contain up to 200 words and 4 keywords.
- Send your summarized CV and a preferred contact.

Directions to be considered before writing your paper

- Papers should be a maximum of 7.500 words (with notes and bibliography included).
- Papers should include: title of the article, author's name and affiliation, abstract and up to 4 keywords. The abstract should have no more than 200 words.
- Papers can be written in Portuguese, English, Spanish, French or Italian. However, they should always include in English the title, the abstract and the keywords.
- Papers should follow the guidelines specified in the *Chicago Manual of Style*:
